Total number of ends: 274 (4 extra ends for spares or for floating selvedges)

Wind warp in 9 separate chains: Make 7 chains of 30 ends. Make 2 chains of 32 ends. Length of warp: 3 ½ yards

Option #2: Scarf in twill weave:

Sett will be 36 epi

Total number of ends: 328 (4 extra ends for spares or for floating selvedges)

Wind warp in 9 separate chains: Make 7 chains of 36 ends. Make 2 chains of 38 ends. Length of warp: 3 ½ yards

Tying your warp chains:

Warp chains require special tying so they can be painted. Tie them **tightly** at the ends and the cross and **very loosely** in the middle with two or three figure-8 ties. (If you don't know how to make figure 8 ties, make your choke ties loose and we can re-tie in the workshop.) Label the two chains with the extra warp ends so you know which ones they are.
