Conference Hotel - The Resort at Squaw Creek

The Resort at Squaw Creek is located 42 miles west of the Reno/Tahoe International Airport, 200 miles east of San Francisco and 100 miles east of Sacramento off Interstate 80 with access to Highway 89 South. At an altitude of 6,200 feet, the weather at Squaw Valley typically provides brilliant California sunshine three out of every four days. Summer temperatures range from an average high in the mid 70s to nighttime lows in the 40s so don't forget something warm for early mornings and evenings.

Conference hotel room rates are \$159/night for a deluxe double queen guest room, \$189/night for a fireplace suite w/ kitchen, and \$209/night for a deluxe fireplace suite w/ kitchen. Rooms accommodate up to four people. Room rates include resort fees, free self parking, free valet parking for handicapped individuals, in-room coffee and tea service, Squaw Valley Shuttle service, unlimited use of the Resort's Health Club Facilities, pool, Jacuzzi, and safe deposit box at the front desk. Beyond standard hotel amenities, your deluxe guest room will include a small refrigerator, robes, and free wireless internet access.

For dining, the Resort offers a choice of three distinctive and delightful restaurants: Six Peaks Grille and Sweet Potatoes Deli for breakfast, lunch and dinner and Sandy's Pub for lunch and dinner. In addition to the restaurant choices for lunch, a fresh salad and sandwich kiosk will be set up on Saturday. And you can always call room service!

We're thrilled to announce the Resort has extended our great conference rates to all registrants for three days before and after our event so that family and friends have the opportunity to join you for a fantastic mini-vacation! June is the perfect time, before the crowds, to enjoy countless outdoor activities in Tahoe!

It is important that you contact the resort at least thirty days prior to your arrival date and identify yourself as part of the CNCH 2013 group; provide the Resort with your name, address, email address (if any), requested room type, bed type (king, double/double, queen or suites), check-in and check-out dates. Requests for special room arrangements must be made at the time of this call. The Resort will require a deposit equal to the room rate and tax for the first night for each reservation.

A Timed Shuttle Race and Concours d'Elegance


Would you like your retired shuttles to race again? This will be a perfect opportunity to challenge your engineering and creative skills! With a few modifications, your shuttle can be one of 40 entrants speeding down our 42 foot raceway, going for either a gold, silver, or bronze medal! Can't you hear the crowd cheering already?

Don't dilly-dally!!! Sign up now as we only have the room and the time for 40 entries in our souped-up Timed Shuttle Race! Staying within specifications for weight, width, and wheels, be creative and enter the FUN as your friends and fellow fiber enthusiasts cheer beside the raceway! Medals will be awarded to the three fastest contenders.

But Wait! If you're not the "racing" type... enter the **Concours d'Elegance** "Best of Show" for a \$50 purse. Create the **sleekest, smartest, sassiest, silliest** shuttle. There are no size or weight restrictions for this category unless you also want to enter your creation in the Timed Shuttle Race.

To adapt weaving shuttles for our derby race, we suggest going to Pinewood Derby retailers to accessorize your shuttles with the proper wheels, axles, and weights. All shuttles will be raced on an official Pinewood Derby Raceway; therefore, all racing shuttles must conform to the following Pinewood Derby Car Specifications.

- 1. The overall width including accessories shall not exceed 2 ¾"
- 2. The overall height of the car shall not exceed 3"
- 3. The bottom clearance of the shuttle shall be no less than 3/8"
- 4. The inside wheel width (distance between left front and right front wheels and distance between left rear and right rear wheels) shall be no less than 1 3/4" and no more than 2 3/4".
- 5. Weight shall not exceed 7 ounces

Felted Shot-Put Throw Challenge

Yep, this is your opportunity to show us your muscle as you'll be hefting and throwing a 3 lb. weighted felted bag on a marked course! You don't think we'd make it easy on you do you? After all, this is an Olympic textile competition. For advanced level training films — you'd best Google past Olympian shot-putters. Three medals will be awarded based on distance achieved.

Drop Spindle Slalom Race

In recognition of our ancient foremothers (and possibly forefather or two?) who spun yarn while minding the children, watching the livestock, and foraging for tasty herbs and fruits... Our Slalom Race will challenge your spinning skill while traversing a flat-zigzag-coned course, spinning a provided length of prepared roving with your favorite drop spindle! Both time over the course and the amount of yarn spun will count toward your winning score. Medals will be awarded to the top three competitors.

Make Your Own Lanyard Competition

Create a unique lanyard to which you will attach the conference 3" x 4" name badge and holder included in your registration packet. Your creativity is the limit! Lanyards will be judged by three of our instructors. Drop off your Lanyard (with your name badge attached) in a designated area in our Olympic Arena from 5:30 to 6:00 p.m. on Friday, May 31. Judging will take place between 6:00 and 6:30 p.m. Be sure to collect your lanyard at 6:30 p.m. Medals will be awarded during our award ceremony on Friday evening!

Textile Parade of both Modeled Wearable and Non-Wearable Entries

This informal and fun parade shows off your recent handmade fashions and creations! If you can wear it and/or carry it while waving a numbered ID paddle with a free hand, please become a participant in our Opening Ceremony activities by entering our Textile Parade! After the parade, non-wearable entries will be displayed on tables in the Olympic Arena for viewing and voting on Friday evening. (Non-wearable items can include household items, baskets, vessels, tapestries, handspun, yardage, etc.) While there will not be any official judging of entries, you do have the opportunity to win a 2013 Textile Olympic medal by "People's Choice" votes for both wearable and non-wearable entries.

An inventoried descriptive list of all items entered in the Textile Parade will be provided to all attendees on Friday evening along with ballots to mark your three favorites in each category. Just drop your marked ballots in the box near the door before retiring for the evening. Medals will be awarded to three entrants in each category. Winners will be announced during the Saturday evening Awards Ceremony!
